Groundbreaking Announcement



"We are standing here today in the Village of Senakw. Since time immemorial, Senakw has been important to our Nation. This village was an important cultural, social and trading hub. Our People hunted elk and deer off the land, fished, and collected medicines from the surrounding forest. While we were displaced, we fought hard to reclaim Senakw. And now, it will once again provide for our People. We thank the Government of Canada for engaging in this new partnership with us as we move forward to building development that will provide a legacy for generations of Squamish to come." September 6, 2022 marked a momentous occasion for the Senakw project, Nch'kay and the Squamish Nation. A groundbreaking ceremony and financing announcement were held on-site which was attended by Elders, Paitsmauk and Aggie Andrews; Cultural workers, Sesiyám Ray Natraoro, Xatsilano Siyám Victor Harry and Ch'enáwxtn-Swu7wu Gabriel Billy; Youth representatives Johnny Williams, Aidan Baker, and Brandon McReynolds; Nation Councillors including Council Chairperson Khelsilem, Council Spokesperson Sxwíxwtn Wilson Williams and Councillor Sumkwhat Shayla Jacobs; Nation staff including many department Directors, and the new Chief of Staff Peter Baker; and Mindy Wight's executive team at Nch'kay Development

Politicians in attendance included the Right Honourable Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, the Honorable Minister Ahmed Hussen, the Honorable Minister Patty Hadju, the Honorable Minister Marc Miller, and the Honorable Minister Jonathon Wilkinson. Also in attendance were MLA David Eby and MP Dr. Hedy Fry.

The announcement marks the start of groundbreaking on Phase 1 of the Project and announces the \$1.4 billion construction loan for Phases 1 and 2 of the Project, which is around 3,000 homes. This project is the largest First Nations economic partnership and the largest loan from the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC) in Canadian history.

This event was necessary for construction financing. A groundbreaking celebration is currently being planned by Squamish Nation staff for all Squamish Members to attend, stay tuned on the Squamish Nation facebook page and website for announcements.

Financing Details - Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Who is the loan made out to? Who is responsible for repayment?

A: The CMHC Loan is made to the project specific entities and is also guaranteed to be repaid by Westbank and OPTrust, the Squamish Nation carries no direct liability and there will be no cash calls to the Squamish Nation. The loan will be paid down over time by project cashflows as supported by the proforma.

Q: Why is the loan so favourable?

A: This loan carries a 10-year term and much more favourable provisions than would be available from traditional lenders – importantly, the interest rate is fixed for 10 years at low rates at a time when rates continue to rapidly climb throughout the rest of the financing market. This would not have been possible without the support of the Squamish Nation for the project, and for acting quickly, especially in the time of rising interest rates. There will be no cash calls to the Nation to support the loan.





Construction Update





The Building Permit for Excavation and Shoring was received from the Nation Permitting Department on August 24. Bulk excavation will begin in early October, where archaeologists will be on site to monitor as per the Archaeological Protocol Agreement.

Trees have been taken down and remedial excavation has begun to get the site ready to start bulk excavation. Some construction progress photos are below. Employment Opportunities are available to Nation members, continue to check senakw.com/careers for current opportunities.
